NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF LOCAL LAW SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM

PLEASE BE ADVISED, that at a public hearing held on the 2nd day of June 2025, the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Farmingdale duly adopted local law 7 of 2025 A copy of that local law is set forth below. This local law is not yet effective and is subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to Article 9 of the Village Law of the State of New York.

The aforementioned local law which is subject to permissive referendum:

Chapter 164. Salaries and Compensation

Article I. Mayor and Board of Trustees

§ 164-1. Compensation of Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Trustees.

The salary of each Trustee of the Board of Trustees, other than the Deputy Mayor of the Incorporated Village of Farmingdale, shall be the sum of \$20,000 per annum, and the salary of the Trustee who holds the position of Deputy Mayor shall be \$21,000 per annum, and the salary of the Mayor of the Incorporated Village of Farmingdale shall be the sum of \$45,000 per annum, all of which compensation shall be paid monthly.

§ 164-2. When effective.

This local law is subject to a permissive referendum and is effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York, provided no petition is filed against this local law within the time allowed pursuant to Article 9 of the Village Law.

In accordance with Article 9 of the Village Law of the State of New York, said local law shall not take effect until thirty (30) days after this notice of its adoption; nor until approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of such village voting on such proposition for its approval if, within thirty (30) days after this notice of its adoption, there be filed with the Village Clerk, of the Inc. Village of Farmingdale, a petition signed and acknowledged by electors of the Inc. Village of Farmingdale, in number equal to at least twenty per centum of such electors in the Village, as shown on the register of electors for the previous general Village election, protesting against such local law and requesting that it be submitted to the electors of the Incorporated Village of Farmingdale for their approval or disapproval, in accordance with Article 9 of the Village Law of the State of New York.
